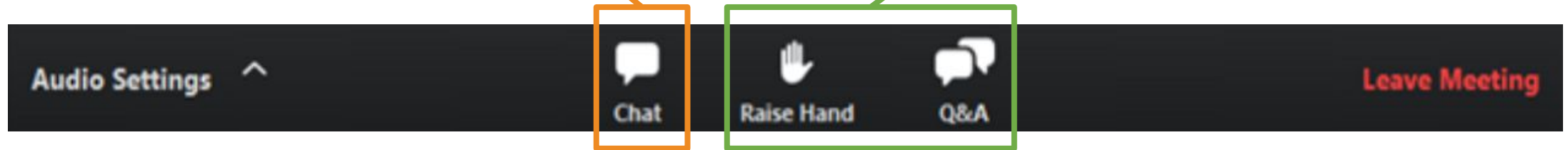

Racial & Economic Equity

In the context of social services:

Racial equity is the condition achieved when a person's racial identity does not predict, in a statistical sense, their ability to access and benefit from quality services or the outcomes of these services.

Economic equity is the condition achieved when a person's income and/or wealth does not predict their ability to access and benefit from quality services* or the outcomes of these services.

**Quality services include free, sliding scale, and fee-based services*

What is Trauma?

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) defines trauma as:

“An event, series of events, or set of circumstances that is experienced by an individual as physically or emotionally harmful or threatening and that has lasting adverse effects on the individual’s functioning and physical, social, emotional, or spiritual well-being.”

Trauma-Informed Approach

What is a Trauma-Informed Approach?

A trauma-informed approach to social service delivery ensures that service providers are educated about trauma, understand how it can impact service participants' present-day behavior, needs, and service participation across settings services, and populations, and adjust their work with service participants accordingly.

A strong Trauma-Informed Approach is built with:

- Organizational commitment from leadership and staff
- Trauma-informed evidence and values
- Resources prioritized for implementation and sustainability
